Our next <u>potluck is taking place Wednesday the 19th September in the gym of the Victoria</u>

IF YOU ARE ATTENDING THE POTLUCK WE ASK ALSO THAT YOU PARK ONLY ON THE SPORTS FIELD SIDE OF THE PARKING LOT OR ON THE STREET. ALSO WOULD YOU PLEASE ENTER THE FRIENDSHIP CENTRE FROM THE LOWER DOOR OFF THE PARKING LOT. The potluck is held in the gym at the far end of that corridor

There will be a presentation about the history of Metis firearms use, mostly related to the fur trade and the Buffalo hunting. If you want, bring your cameras for "photo-ops" too. Our presenters' will be dressed in period clothing and if you want, you can wear your finest traditional Metis clothing too? Al and Gary will be bringing about 30 to 35 guns in total to display covering the era from about 1800 until the turn of the century. (From the flint era to the cartridge repeating rifle era). They will also have some fur trade items to display as well as some early hand loading tools that would have been used for loading cartridges out on the trail.

VOLUNTEERS FOR THE SCHOOLS

We are inviting community musicians, dancers, artisans, artists, storytellers of all ages to accompany the MNGV's Education Coordinator into the classrooms for a brief demonstration or to assist with cultural crafts for the 2012-13 program.

The program consists of two visits per classroom. During Session One, the Education Coordinator presents a historical overview of Metis heritage and traditions to the class. In Session Two, a community member demonstrates an aspect of Metis culture and then students work on a cultural activity. As a special guest, Metis volunteers are not required to go into the classrooms alone.

If you can jig, bead, sing, play fiddle or any instrument; or if you wish to showcase artwork, speak about traditional practices, history, family traditions and folklore, your contributions will be highly valuable to our Metis children and MNGV's education program.

School volunteers require a Criminal Record Check with no costs involved. The CRC forms and a letter from MNGV verifying you are volunteering will be available to you. You are required to take this information in person to the local police detachment in your area.
