Mr. Gladue traces his Métis roots back to the Red River settlement, through both his father's and mother's lineage.

*Mr. Gladue recently retired from the RCMP after 26 years of distinguished service working with aboriginal and non-aboriginal communities in British Columbia and Canada. Mr. Gladue was **the** RCMP representative on the team responsible for bringing the Drug and Alcohol Awareness (DARE) program to Canada as well as an integral part of the development of the Aboriginal Shield program in Canada. During his long and illustrious career with the RCMP, Mr. Gladue developed and honed his skills as a **community developer**, a **strategic thinker**, an expert **team builder** and a **persuasive negotiator**, seasoned in conflict mitigation and resolution.*

Mr. Gladue's accomplishments include being appointed to the Pacific Métis Federation as the Justice Committee member; the Founding Member (BC) of the Canadian National Aboriginal Shield Program; the founding member of the Provincial DARE Program as well as the founding member of the NVIT Law Enforcement Preparatory Program.

Mr. Gladue feels strongly about his heritage as a Métis person and wishes to use his experience and expertise during this pivotal time in Métis history to advance the cause of the Métis people provincially, nationally and globally. Accordingly, Mr. Gladue is currently seeking to become the next President of the Métis Nation BC.
